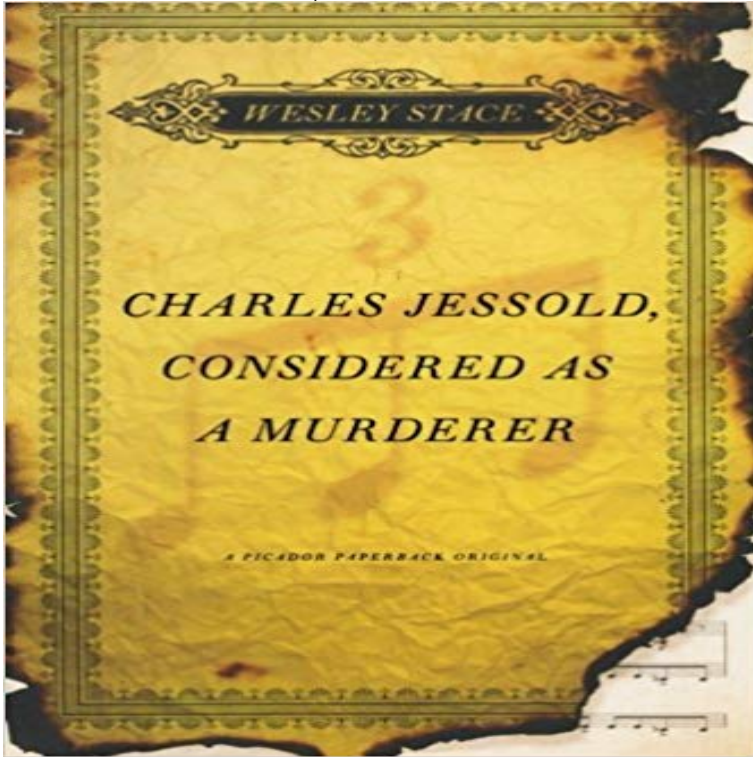


Charles Jessold, Considered as a Murderer
