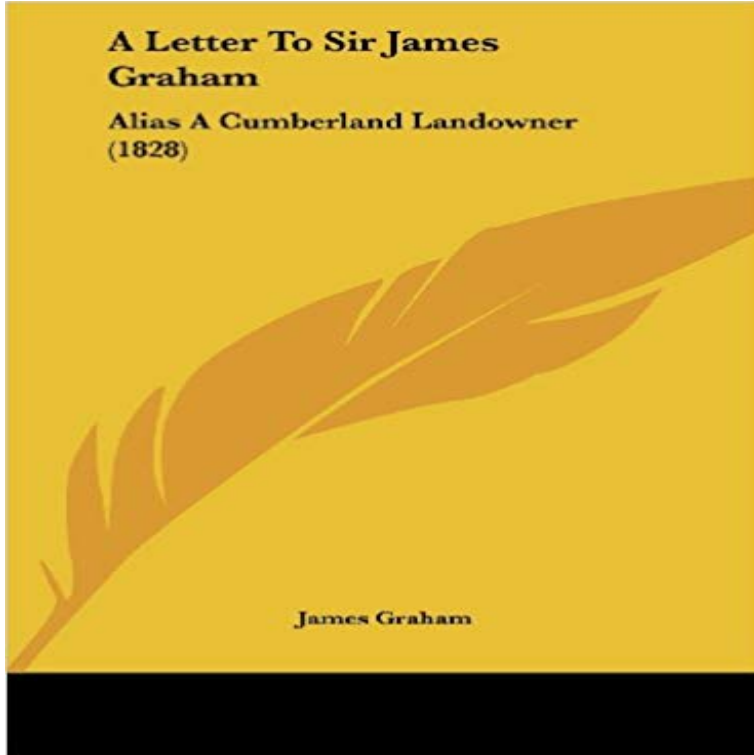


# A Letter to Sir James Graham: Alias a Cumberland Landowner (1828)
