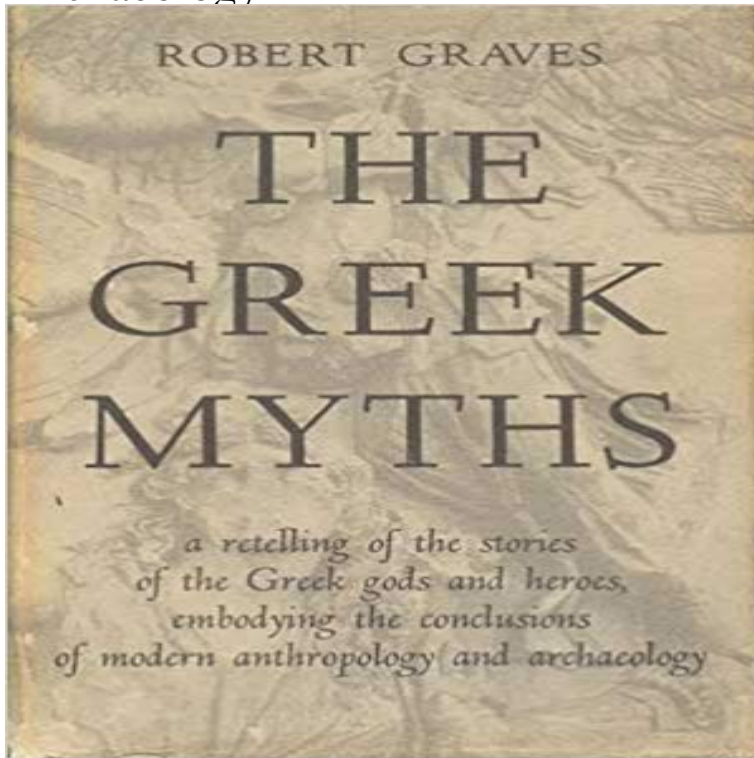


The Greek Myths : A Retelling of the Stories of the Greek Gods and Heroes, Embodying the Conclusions of Modern Anthropology and Archaeology
