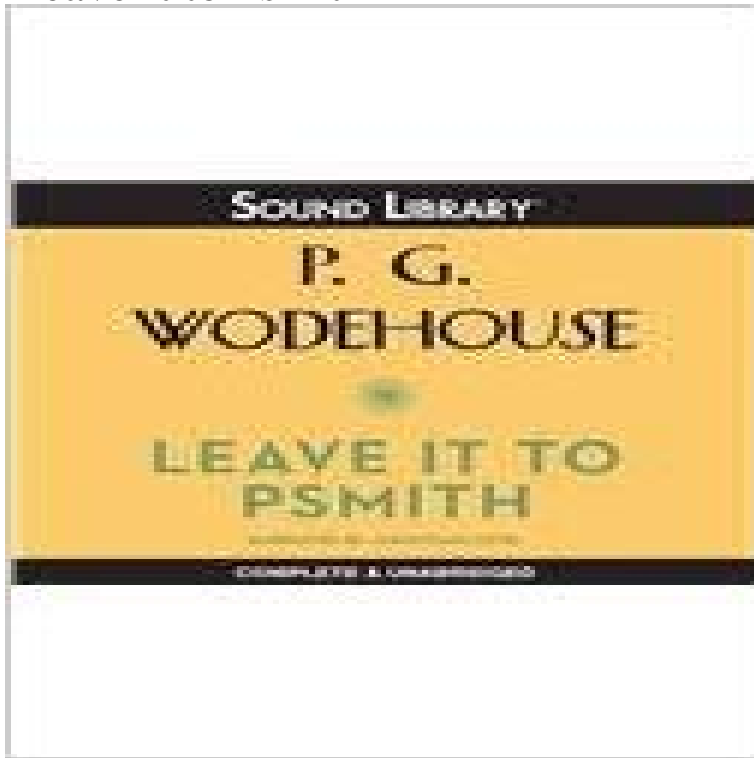


Leave It to Psmith
