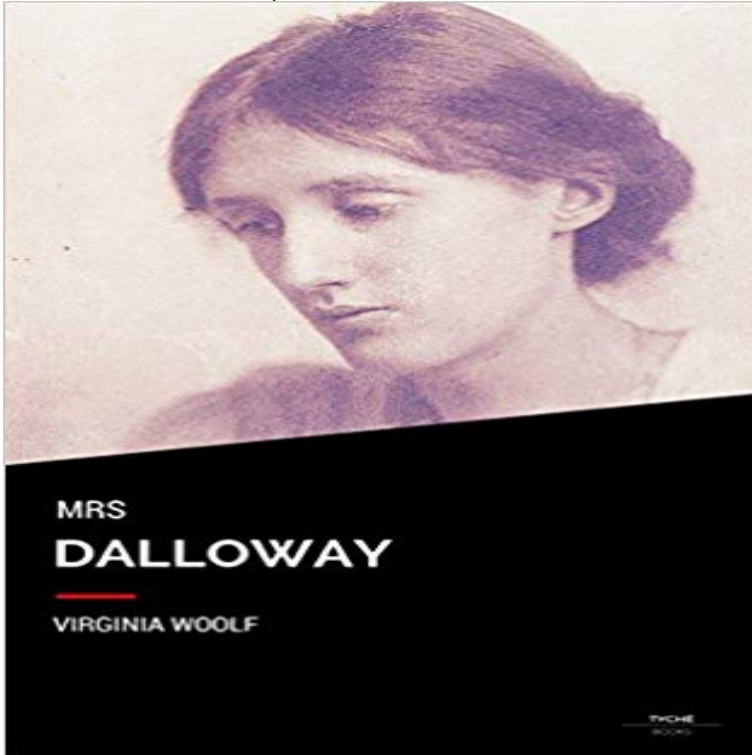


Mrs Dalloway
