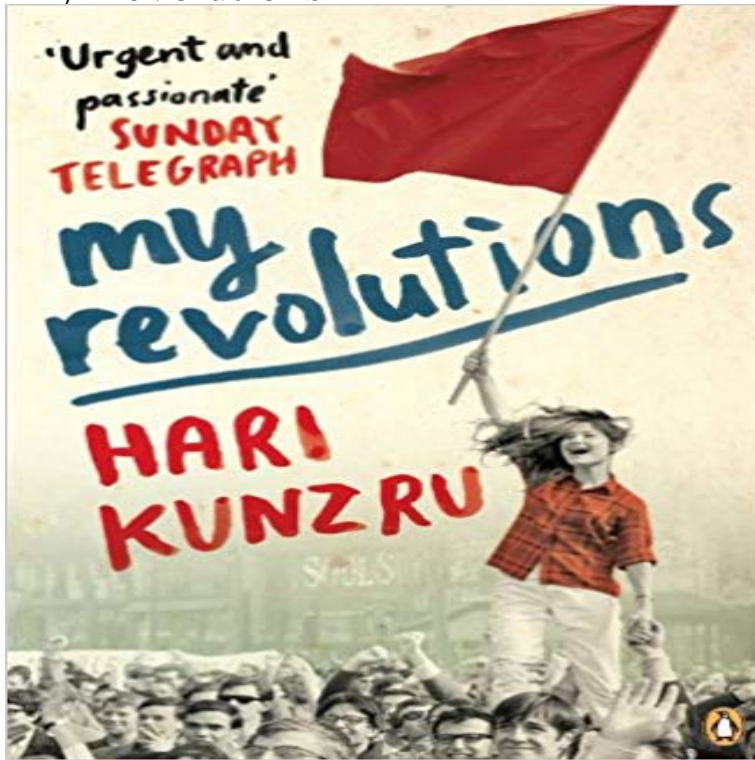


My Revolutions
