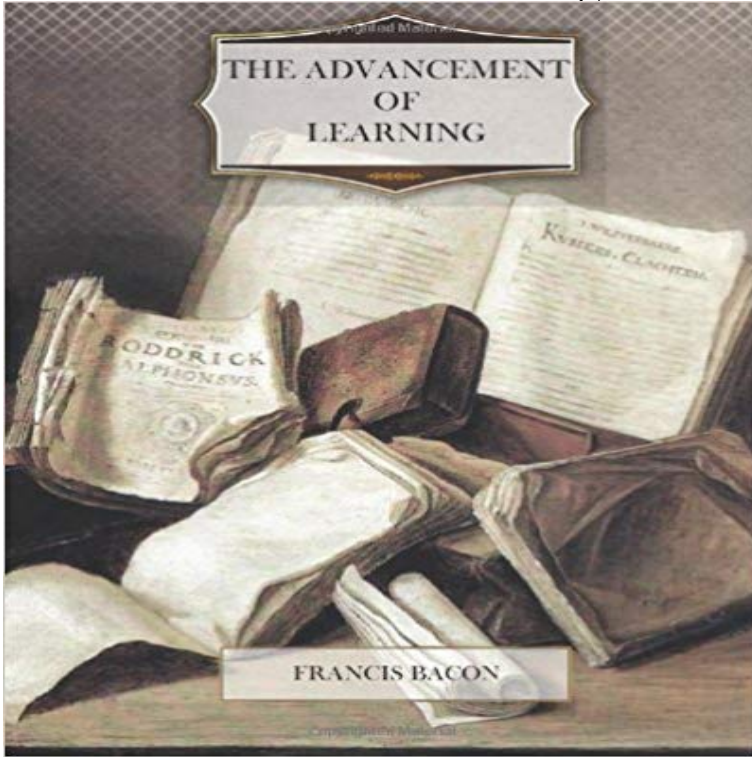


The Advancement of Learning
